The Garfield PTA is hosting a community conversation on food in the Corvallis School District. All are invited! They’re hoping to have parents from all schools, teachers, and community members provide feedback and ideas on how we can all work together to provide the best food possible for children in our community. They will provide childcare, a light snack, and simultaneous Spanish interpretation at the event.

## LONG RANGE FACILITIES Meeting: From the Superintendent’s Office

Our district includes seven K-5 elementary schools, two 6-8 middle schools, two comprehensive 9-12 high schools, one K-8 school, and alternative education programs at the Harding Center. With all but two schools constructed before 1971, the average age of our elementary school buildings is 59 years.

We are now beginning to gather public input on the draft long-range facility plan. Targeting the May 2018 special election for a continuation of our facilities bond, there will be opportunities for parents, staff, and the community to provide input for the draft plan before the school board finalizes a plan to put before voters.

Focus areas in the draft plan are:

- ✓ Address critical safety needs and complete capital improvements in all schools.
- ✓ Improve inclusivity of school buildings by eliminating all modular classrooms.
- ✓ Address growing deferred maintenance costs.
- ✓ Enlarge and develop project based learning areas in secondary schools.

Public outreach activities, telephone surveys, and school information meetings will take place this fall. Our school community will have an opportunity to review the school concept plan for Mt. View Elementary on October 17 at 6:30 pm. We encourage all families to get involved in this stage of the planning process. Nuestro distrito incluye siete escuelas primarias K-5, dos escuelas medias 6-8, dos escuelas secundarias completas de 9-12, una escuela K-8 y programas de educación alternativa en el Harding Center. Con todas las escuelas excepto dos de ellas fueron construidas antes de 1971, la edad promedio de nuestros edificios de escuelas de primaria es de 59 años. Ahora estamos comenzando a recopilar opinión pública sobre el proyecto de plan de infraestructuras a largo plazo. Nos enfocaremos en las elecciones especiales de mayo del 2018 para la continuación del financiamiento de nuestras infraestructuras, habrá oportunidades para que los padres, el personal y la comunidad proporcionen sus aportes para el proyecto antes de que la junta directiva concluya un plan para presentarlo a los votantes.

Las áreas de enfoque en el proyecto del plan son:

? Abordar las necesidades críticas de seguridad y completar las mejoras estructurales en todas las escuelas.

? Mejorar la integración de los edificios escolares al eliminar todas las aulas modulares.

? Abordar los crecientes costos de mantenimiento diferidos.

? Ampliar y desarrollar áreas de aprendizaje basadas en los proyectos de las escuelas secundarias.
