

School Delays and Cancellations due to Inclement Weather

How We Decide to Delay or Cancel School

The safety of students is our primary consideration. In any situation where safety is a concern, the superintendent consults with district staff and/or regional agencies to make informed decisions regarding risk factors. Safety considerations include:

- student drivers, student access to bus stops, students walking to/from school and all other aspects of transporting students to and from school
- the suitability of our facilities for occupation, as well as the condition of local infrastructure

It is important to remember that the school year calendar includes nine possible weather make up days including December 22, January 26, February 19, March 16, and June 18-22. **The December 22 date will be used as a make-up day only if we have a school cancellation day on or before December 8.**

How We Communicate School Delays or Cancellation

In the event of the decision to delay or cancel school, an alert will immediately be shared via the district website, the FlashAlert newswire, and social media. Parents and guardians will be notified through a School Messenger automated call, typically at 6:00 am or 7:00 pm depending on area weather conditions.

In the event of a school emergency, please do not call the school. We will relay information to parents/guardians as soon as possible. Emergency updates are recorded on the district emergency hotline at 541-757-4555. Our goal is to respond quickly in order to minimize the impact of an emergency situation and to provide accurate information to parents and if necessary, emergency personnel. For community public safety messages we recommend opting-in to the Linn-Benton Alert Notification System. More details are available on the Benton County website at:

How We Communicate about Snow Routes for Buses
